<b>AB 18 (Pan)</b>	Pediatric Dental Plans: Unnecessary MLR Mandate	<b>OPPOSE unless AMENDED</b>	CAHU OPPOSES AB 18 unless amended, that establishes an unnecessary medical loss ratio for pediatric dental plans of 75 percent. CAHU believes this is an inappropriate application of a medical plan concept that would essentially eliminate the offer of the most cost-effective pediatric dental options—dental HMOs—when offered as a stand-alone program.	<i>Assembly Appropriations</i> <b>2 YEAR BILL</b> 6/25/2013
<b>AB 186 (Maienschein)</b>	Professions and vocations: military spouses: temporary licenses.	<b>SUPPORT</b>	CAHU SUPPORTS AB 186 that provides for a reasonable temporary 18-month license extension for a spouse or partner who relocates to accompany active duty military posted to duty in California	<i>Senate Business &amp; Professions</i>  <i>As of 7/1/2013</i> <b>2 YEAR BILL</b>
<b>AB 362 (Ting)</b>	Income Tax Relief: Federally Excluded Health Care Expenses: Same Sex Spouses/ Partners	<b>SUPPORT</b>	CAHU SUPPORTS AB 362 that provides state tax relief for employees that receive compensation from an employer to reimburse federal income taxes paid by the employee because, for federal income tax purposes, the same-sex spouse or domestic partner of the employee is not considered the spouse of the employee under federal law for health care insurance purposes.	<b>SIGNED by Governor</b> 10/1/2013  <b>CHAPTER 439, Statutes of 2013</b>
<b>AB 396 (Fox)</b>	Prescriptions: Consumer Choice: Labels	<b>SUPPORT</b>	CAHU SUPPORTS AB 396 that gives health care consumers a choice on whether they wish to have information on their prescription bottle that clearly lists the medicine as well as the medical condition the prescribed medicine is to treat.	<i>Introduced ASSEMBLY</i> 2/15/2013  <b>2-YEAR BILL</b>

<b>AB 402</b> <b>(Ammiano)</b>	Disability income insurance: mental illness.	<b>NEUTRAL</b>	Originally opposed, CAHU reviewed proposed clarifying amendments to AB 402 that limit application of the bill to only short-term disability insurance coverage of severe mental illness - - a change that aligns with industry practice. As amended CAHU is NEUTRAL on AB 402.	<b>SIGNED by Governor 10/14/2013</b>  <b>CHAPTER 550, Statutes of 2013</b>
<b>AB 880</b> <b>(Gomez)</b>	New Large Employer Penalties: Health Care	<b>OPPOSE</b>	CAHU is working with a coalition of employer organizations to OPPOSE AB 880, that seeks to impose a number of significant new penalties on large private employers with 500 or more (full time and part time combined) employees in California if an employee, that works as little as 12 hours per week, enrolls in Medi-Cal, among other onerous provisions. <b>AB 889</b> <b>(Fraser)</b>	Prescriptions	<b>OPPOSE</b>	CAHU OPPOSES AB 889 that changes requirements on use of step therapies in health plans and reduces health plan flexibility in RX benefit management, increases health care costs and premiums, thereby reducing ability to offer an affordable choice of benefit packages.	<i>Senate Appropriations SUSPENSE FILE</i>  <b>HELD on SUSPENSE FILE: 8/30/2013</b>
<b>AB 912</b> <b>(Quirk-Silva)</b>	Health care coverage: fertility preservation.	<b>OPPOSE</b>	CAHU OPPOSES AB 912, although well meaning, would increase the cost of health care by up \$3million annually by adding new mandate for fertility preservation.	<b>VETOED by Governor 10/5/2013</b>
<b>AB 1082</b> <b>(Williams)</b>	New Paystub Mandate: Healthcare	<b>OPPOSE</b>	CAHU is working with a coalition of employer organizations to OPPOSE AB 1082, which mandates new payroll stub mandate that requires all employers add new information regarding amount of health care coverage provided an employee per paycheck.	<i>Assembly Appropriations</i>  <b>HELD on SUSPENSE: 5/24/2013</b>

<b>AB 1180 (Pan)</b>	State-Federal Conformity: HIPAA and state conversion products	<b>SUPPORT</b>	CAHU SUPPORTS AB 1180 that resolves an important state-federal conformity issue by helping avoid a situation where health plans, absent this legislation, would be required to sell federal HIPAA and state conversion products that are out of compliance with the ACA.	<b>SIGNED by Governor 10/1/2013</b> <b>CHAPTER 441, Statutes of 2013</b>
<b>AB 1355 (Wilk)</b>	Limited liability companies: indemnification: agents.	<b>OPPOSE UNLESS AMENDED</b>	CAHU is working with a business coalition to address concerns regarding possible limited liability company (LLC) lawsuit exposure for acts of agents or employees.	<i>Assembly Judiciary 2/22/2013</i> <b>2-YEAR BILL</b>
<b>AB 1372 (Bonilla)</b>	Health insurance: pervasive developmental disorder or autism.	<b>SUPPORT</b>	CAHU SUPPORTS AB 1372, which ensures continued access to care for those with autism by extending the sunset on the definition of providers authorized to treat this disorder.	<i>Assembly Health</i> <b>2-YEAR BILL</b>
<b>SB 126 (Steinberg)</b>	Health care coverage: pervasive developmental disorder or autism.	<b>SUPPORT</b>	CAHU SUPPORTS SB 126, which ensures continued coverage for those with autism or developmental disorders by extending the program sunset date from 2014 to 2020.	<b>SIGNED by Governor 10/9/2013</b> <b>CHAPTER 680, Statutes of 2013</b>
<b>SB 161 (Hernandez)</b>	Stop-loss insurance coverage.	<b>NEUTRAL POSITION as AMENDED</b>	SB 161, which deals with stop loss coverage for small employers, was substantially amended to address major concerns of stop loss insurers, Cal Chamber and agent organizations. CAHU has removed opposition and now has no position on SB 161.	<b>SIGNED by Governor 10/1/2013</b> <b>CHAPTER 443, Statutes of 2013</b>

<b>SB 320 (Beall)</b>	Health care coverage: acquired brain injury.	<b>OPPOSE</b>	CAHU OPPOSES SB 320, which, though well meaning, would increase health insurance costs by establishing a new coverage mandate for acquired brain injuries.	<i>Senate Appropriations</i> <b>HELD on</b> <b>SUSPENSE FILE</b> <b>5/23/2013</b>
<b>SB 353 (Lieu)</b>	Health Insurance: Marketing Materials: New Interpreter Mandate	<b>OPPOSE</b>	CAHU OPPOSES SB 353 which will add new mandate on plans and agents to use professional interpreters to translate welcome letters notices of essential benefits, among other documents that may be provided to health care insurance consumers, if that company markets services in a language other than English.	<b>SIGNED by</b> <b>Governor</b> <b>10/1/2013</b> <b>CHAPTER 447,</b> <b>Statutes of 2013</b>
<b>SB 494 (Monning)</b>	Health Care Practitioners: Expanded Access	<b>SUPPORT</b>	CAHU SUPPORTS SB 494 that broadens access to care for health care consumers by permitting physicians to more effectively use the skills of physician assistants and nurse practitioners in their practices.	<b>SIGNED by</b> <b>Governor</b> <b>10/9/2013</b> <b>CHAPTER 684,</b> <b>Statutes of 2013</b>
<b>SB 509 (DeSaulnier)</b>	HBEX: Pre-employment Background Checks	<b>SUPPORT</b>	CAHU supports SB 509 to will require responsible pre-engagement and pre-employment background checks for those working with or associated with the California Health Benefit Exchange and Covered California.	<b>SIGNED by</b> <b>Governor</b> <b>6/18/2013</b> <b>Chapter 10, Statutes</b> <b>of 2013</b>

<b>SB 639</b> <b>(Hernandez)</b>	Health Benefit Exchange Plans: Competition Elimination	<b>NEUTRAL</b>	Originally opposed due to unreasonable mandates to standardize all plans inside and out of the Exchanges, plus rigid out of pocket maximums, SB 639 was amended to address CAHU concerns by eliminating standardization language and revising upward out-of-pocket maximums to federally permitted \$6,500 individual and \$12,700 families, among other improvements to the bill. CAHU subsequently NEUTRAL on SB 639	<b>SIGNED by Governor 9/20/2013</b>  <b>CHAPTER 316, Statutes of 2013</b>
<b>SB 746 (Leno)</b>	Health Plans: New Paperwork Mandate	<b>OPPOSE</b>	CAHU OPPOSES SB 746 that would place burdensome reporting requirements on health plans and attempts to insert the legislature in into a private, voluntary contract discussion between a plan and a large group purchaser.	<b>VETOED by Governor 10/13/2013</b>
